



## Bachelor of Science in Criminology Degree Program

This degree offers a practical, theory-based interdisciplinary education that stresses human behavior, social and cultural dynamics, communication, and leadership. The criminology curriculum addresses the increasingly complex environment in which professionals associated with crime analysis, law enforcement, public safety and security, the criminal justice system, regulatory agencies, and social support work toward the improvement and transformation of society. Students will be given the option to take graduate-level courses at the end of their senior year toward a Master of Arts degree in Criminology.
